Walk path near Indigenous Peoples Garden


**Reflection/Discussion- 03:30 pm-04:30pm**

The Reconciliation Walk is delivered as informational and educational walk that follows a timeline of residential school history in Canada. The walk will take place in Assiniboine Park, Indigenous Gardens between 10:30am to 3:30pm. The event will start with Sacred Fire ceremony at 09:30am. Caution regarding intensity of emotions will be presented as well. People can come and go on their own schedule. The informational, educational walk starts at 10:30 am and is open until 3:30pm and mostly takes about an hour to 90 minutes to go through the path.

The Walk provides non-Indigenous Canadians with an opportunity to learn about the timeline of Canada's Residential Schools Legacy through an interactive and meaningful, educational experience.

Assiniboine Park is located on Treaty 1 territory within the Province of Manitoba, the traditional lands of the Anishinaabe, Cree, Oji-Cree, Dene, and Dakota Peoples, and the National Homeland of the Red River Métis.
